


## **About the Position**

Reporting to and in collaboration with the President, the Principal is the spiritual and educational leader of the school directly responsible for its daily operation, instruction, and learning. Along with the President, the Principal works for the overall good and betterment of the school, faculty, staff, and students by seeking to offer high-quality academic and student-life programs that are integrated with the truths, values, and traditions of the Catholic Church. S/he maintains a close working relationship with the faculty, staff, and students, as well as parents and the community at large. The Principal is supported by an academic team comprised of the Dean of Academics, Dean of Formation, Dean of Arts and Athletics, and the Safety Manager who serve as his/her direct reports.

## **About John Paul II High School**

John Paul II High School opened its doors in 2005 with a vision of creating a Catholic college preparatory school that would empower students to excel in every aspect of their lives. In its first year, JPII welcomed 300 students in grades 9-11 occupying half of the brand-new facility. Since then, the school has grown steadily into a vibrant community of more than 700 learners representing diverse backgrounds and approximately 90 faculty and support staff. This year, this young and vibrant school is celebrating twenty years of growth and success for their Cardinal family.

The JPII campus is located five miles from downtown Plano, Texas, and 20 miles north of downtown Dallas. The school sits on 48.5 acres and boasts 317,000 square feet of state-of-the-art educational space. The classrooms are equipped with advanced technology — including Al-based advanced motion tracking — for both in-person and remote learning. The school added an athletic complex for football, soccer, and track in 2008. In 2011, the school's state-of-the-art East Sports Complex was opened, which includes softball and baseball fields, as well as eight championship tennis courts.







JPII represents the next generation of Catholic schools — one that believes the integral formation students receive from a Catholic school engenders a lifelong responsibility to God and fellow man. Recipients of a JPII education are equipped with the tools, knowledge, and skills not only to thrive in college but also to become morally grounded critical thinkers and socially responsible future leaders of the world. The school's formative education is based on the belief that educating the whole person — academic, spiritual, emotional, and physical — leads to personal transformation. Together, the JPII community makes a difference in the world by walking in the footsteps of St. John Paul II.

- Must be a practicing Catholic in good standing with the Catholic Church.



## About Plano, Texas


Plano is an economically thriving community in the north end of the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex. The current population is around 260,000.
